- More than \$23.5 million in federal grant funds distributed by the Tennessee Highway Safety Office to support highway safety efforts.
- Over \$4.8 million in federal grant funds distributed by the Tennessee Office of Homeland Security to enhance county-level Homeland Security preparedness and response capabilities.



- 8 out of 10 crashes involving a distracted driver occurred in urban areas.
- One in three fatal crashes involved a DUI.
- 1,315 traffic fatalities in 2022.
